How many of you know of Valerie Browning, former Adelaide nurse, married to an Ethiopian man, and giving her life, love and skills to the people of Afar, Ethiopia, where she is called "The Angel of the Desert." The region is beset by drought, pests, hunger and now cholera. She and her husband created the Afar Pastoralist Development Association (APDA). Listening to her tonight brought home to me how different her life might have been, and how much she values the life she is living — which she sees as a privilege. One of Valerie's major areas of focus is education and again, I reflect on how privileged we are to be able to continue our life-long learning, sharing our skills and experience in peace and comfort.

The September issue of <u>COTA Connects</u> features an article *The Joy of Informal Learning* – about U3A across Australia, written by U3A Queensland. I am sure you will find it both familiar and interesting.

Finally, we can rejoice that between us, we are bringing value to each other's lives. Our membership has passed 300. Together we provide friendship and *stay active* – *mentally, physically, and socially.*

NEW CLASS ENROLMENT INFORMATION

Going Online with Member Wizard

At the end of this year, we are moving to a new system for enrolments. This will streamline the process and also bring some savings. We will keep you informed of changes as the end of the year gets closer.

<u>Try out the Member Wizard Membership Portal for yourself.</u>

The Board and a number of members have tried out the portal and we recommend you do the same. You can do this on your phone, or your iPad or tablet, or your computer. To do this you will need to be a registered member of Campbelltown U3A with an email address on our database.

- 1. Go to the Membership Portal at https://member-portal.memberwizard.com.au and input your email address that you use with U3A Campbelltown. Tap the Check Email Address button and follow the on-screen instructions.
- 2. The system will send a verification code to your email which you will enter on the screen.
- 3. Set your pin with a 4-digit number that you will not forget (year of birth is a good one).
- 4. Once you have access to the Membership Portal you should be able to see your registration details, a list of the classes you are enrolled in, as well as a list of everything that is on offer.
- 5. Please let us know if you strike problems.

If you are interested in trying enrolments on Member Wizard at the end of this year, we encourage you to attend the training session to be held at the Marchant Centre on 17 November 2:00-4:00 pm. Bring your device that you have set up the Membership Portal on (see above) with you.



Beaumont House, owned by the National Trust of South Australia, is a State Heritage listed property built in 1849 as Claremont by Bishop Augustus Short

and his wife, Millicent. Bishop Short was the first Anglican Bishop of Adelaide. From 1857, it was the home of Sir Samuel Davenport and his wife, Margaret. Sir Samuel was a politician, horticulturist and pioneer of the olive oil industry in South Australia. In 1907, Major William Vincent and his wife, Alice, were the owners; followed in 1911 by lawyer Richard Bennett KC and his wife, Lilian. Richard died in 1929 and Lilian married Mr Kenneth Brock in 1936. The property was bequeathed to the National Trust in 1970 by the Brocks.

The house has a distinctive Mediterranean character, with an open brickwork parapet in soft terracotta colours, with a central flat roof, originally accessed by a staircase.



The Play Reading group recently attended the play *Cosi* by Louis Nowra put on by the Tea Tree Gully Players. *Cosi* is a play set in a psychiatric institution in the 70's where a director is given the task of pulling together a play using the talent from the ward. It was a very amusing play. Before the play, the group enjoyed a delicious lunch at Pacta Poli

The play Women of Twilight was the drama we studied in August. It is a journey into post War London where unmarried women with babies were shunned and victimised with terrible results.

On Friday 28 July a few U3A Campbelltown members who are enrolled in the Let's Do Lunch group travelled to The Gully Public House & Garden at Tea Tree Gully, where the delightful company enjoyed a delicious pub meal and lots of chatter in the relaxed atmosphere of the charming, historic hotel which was established in 1854.

What an interesting outing was had on Friday 4 August when we visited the Adelaide Holocaust Museum and Andrew Steiner Education

Centre in Wakefield Street. The museum is crammed with information and exhibits about World War II, the victims and survivors of the Holocaust. We had the privilege of meeting Eva Temple who shared her story with us: telling us about the loss of her parents at a tender age, surviving the concentration camp thanks to her grandmother, being adopted after the war, before being reunited with relatives in England and finally coming to Australia. Eva was happy to be photographed with the group outside the museum, as was Tomaz who was our guide and informative

speaker on the day.

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A short walk to the Wakefield Hotel, found some of us having lunch in the back room.

The General Meeting held on Friday 18 August was very well attended by members eager to hear guest speaker, Philip Evans, from the Metropolitan Fire Service talk about the importance of Home Fire Safety. He was keen to answer the many questions posed to him and handed out fridge magnets and information brochures to the attendees. A most impressive demonstration of a kitchen fire in an electric frypan and how to smother it with a fire blanket drove home the fast action and presence of mind required in an emergency situation, along with the details needed to be given to the respondents to a 000 call.

The meeting was followed by a lovely shared afternoon tea.
